Being prepared for the next “whatever” -be it a windstorm, snowstorm, earthquake or extended power outage- is a key element to how well you will cope during such an event. By taking a little time now to assure you and your family are ready can save yourself from the stress of trying to assemble necessary items after a major event has happened. The following are some basic steps to prepare you and your family...

- **Make a plan.** A great resource to help you develop a comprehensive plan is found at www.ready.gov.
- **Prepare for 3-5 days.** During a major event such as an earthquake or snowstorm, it may be a few days before you are able to make it to a store. Have enough food and water stored for each family member (and pets) to last 3-5 days.
- **Build emergency kits for home, office, school and the car.** That way, no matter where you are when a major event occurs, you will be ready.
- **Attend the Woodinville Safety Fair!** Experience hands-on learning to prepare you and your family. (And enjoy free food!)
